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Welcome

Most of your life is online now. Your photos, your emails, your subscriptions, your contacts, your money. When you die, your family inherits passwords they don't have to accounts they don't know exist.

This inventory exists to fix that. It is NOT a password manager, please do not write your live passwords into a paper document. It is a map: which platforms hold what, how to contact each platform, what you want done with each account, and where the actual login details live.

WHAT THIS IS NOT

This is a framework. We are not storing your passwords, and you shouldn't write them on paper either. Use a proper password manager (1Password, Bitwarden, Apple Passwords) and tell your executor the master password, see Part 3.

Part 1, How to think about your digital estate

Your digital life sits in five buckets. Work through each one in turn.

1. Money & value

- Online banking, savings, investment platforms (Hargreaves Lansdown, Vanguard, AJ Bell, etc.).
- Pension dashboards.
- Cryptocurrency holdings (exchanges and self-custody wallets).
- PayPal balance, business platforms (Etsy / eBay / Vinted), Patreon, Substack revenue.

2. Identity & access

- Email accounts, the master keys to most other accounts.
- Apple ID / Google account, gateway to photos, payments, devices.
- Password manager (1Password, Bitwarden, Apple Passwords, LastPass).
- Two-factor authentication apps (Google Authenticator, Authy) and physical security keys.

3. Memory & sentiment

- Photo libraries (Apple Photos / iCloud, Google Photos, Flickr, Dropbox).
- Email archives (years of correspondence).
- Social media posts and message history.

4. Subscriptions & ongoing costs

- Streaming (Netflix, Spotify, Disney+, Apple Music, Audible).
- Productivity (Office 365, Adobe, cloud storage).
- Apps with auto-renewal, these can keep billing for years if no-one cancels.

5. Identity online

- Personal websites, blogs, professional profiles, LinkedIn.
- Online shops, seller accounts, drop-shipping businesses.

WHY THIS MATTERS

Subscriptions billed after death is the single most common digital-life problem grieving
